Besides these more traditional items, there will be a special focus on brand products, as well as brand packaging and its hidden messages for the consumers.

On Thursday 8 November the programme foresees a visit to the Sublitex plant in Alba. Sublitex belongs to the Miroglio Group and is a leading transfer printer on various surfaces for the fashion and home furnishing industry. The company applies modern gravure printing technology, but complementary also digital printing on industrial scale.

As usual the event will provide opportunities to exchange views with colleagues from the industry during the conference, and at the dinner in the Turin store of Eataly, a worldwide known distributor of Italian specialities such as pasta, prosciutto and wine.

We thank our colleagues from Cerutti and Sublitex for their support to organise the event, and we look forward to greeting members and friends of ERA and gravure in Turin and Alba.



Turin

Turin, located at the Po river, is the fourth largest Italian city and an important industrial site (e.g. automotive industry). The city is the capital of the Piedmont region and was the first capital of the modern Italy after the "Risorgimento" (regenesis) in 1861. The history of the regenesis of Italy is shown in the National Museum of the Italian Risorgimento. Turin presents itself with sophisticated architecture, typical Italian "piazas" and atmosphere, as well as many tourist attractions. The city is also known for its famous football club Juventus, winner of the European champions league and record winner of the Italian championship.
